





April 22, 2020



Earthquake Reconstruction: Rebuilding Lives



Hon'ble PM of India Shri Narendra Modi and Rt. Hon'ble PM of Nepal Mr. K.P. Sharma Oli witnessed the remarkable progress in India supported Private Housing Reconstruction Project in Nepal on 21 January 2020.

US\$ 150 million grant for reconstruction in housing sector

50,000 households in 14 Gaupalikas 4 Nagarpalikas and 73 wards across Gorkha and Nuwakot are the direct beneficiaries

26,912 beneficiaries in Gorkha and 23,088 beneficiaries in Nuwakot. The total amount reimbursed to GoN is NPR 6.9 billion as grant in aid Till June 2020, 46,153 (92.3%) houses have been reconstructed 3,523 (7.04%) houses are under construction

Earthquake Reconstruction: Rejuvenating Education



Government of India built Aiselubhume Secondary School in Kispang, Nuwakot district as part of its post-earthquake reconstruction in Nepal. The school was ceremonially inaugurated on 10 February 2020 by Former Prime Minister and Chairman of Nepal Communist Party (NCP) Mr. Pushpa Kamal Dahal (Prachanda). The newly built infrastructure is expected to boost learning environment of students. The project was implemented by Central Level Project Implementation Unit (Education), NRA.

US\$ 50 million grant for reconstruction in the education sector

70 schools and 1 library in 8 districts of Nepal are beneficiaries

The Embassy of India and the Central Level Project Implementation Unit (CLPIU) Education, NRA signed 7 Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) for re-building 56 higher secondary schools located in Gorkha, Nuwakot, Dhading, Dolakha, Kavrepalanchowk, Ramechhap and Sindhupalchok districts of Nepal on 8 June 2020 in Kathmandu.

The tendering process of 6 school and Central Library, Tribhuvan University is ongoing.

Among 70 schools and 1 library, Construction of 7 schools is near completion and 56 schools is underway





Earthquake Reconstruction: Restoring Cultural Heritage



The Embassy of India, Kathmandu signed an agreement with the Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH), India for providing consultancy services for Post-Earthquake reconstruction of Cultural Heritage sites in Nepal on 12 December 2019.

US\$ 50 million grant for reconstruction in the cultural heritage sector

for 28 projects in 8 districts of Nepal.

INTACH is undertaking the Conservation works of 12 Earthquake Affected Cultural Heritage Sites in Nepal.


The projects are in 4 districts, i.e., Kathmandu, Lalitpur, Bhaktapur and Solukhumbhu.

US\$ 750 million in Line of Credit for Earthquake Reconstruction and Other Infrastructure



A Credit Line Agreement for US\$ 750 million was signed between the Government of Nepal and EXIM Bank of india in September 2016. The LOC projects will benefit the Government of Nepal and create valuable infrastructure across Nepal.





Beyond India's immediate neighbourhood, in South East Asia, Central Asia, Africa and Latin America, bilateral projects in Information and Computer Technology (ICT), Small & Medium enterprises and archaeological conservation have been undertaken.




